

GENDER, SEXUALITY, AND WOMEN'S STUDIES WITH TEACHER CERTIFICATION IN ELEMENTARY SCHOOL TEACHER IN GRADES K-6 (B.A.)

Students who wish to pursue K-6 teacher certification in Elementary Education must apply and be admitted to the Teacher Education Program. Once admitted, students will be matriculated into the B.A. in Elementary Education (<http://catalog.montclair.edu/programs/elementary-education-ba/>) program as a second major.
